

## LINDENWOLD - CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE



The warm weather is here and it's time to get outside and SPRING CLEAN.

The Code Enforcement Office would like to bring to your attention some of the top violations and ask that you take the time to CLEAN up your property to avoid a violation letter or summons for noncompliance.

- 1. Junk/Unregistered Vehicles** - Any vehicle that is not legally registered, missing license plates, has flat tires, broken windows, or may be being used for storage of materials of all types.
- 2. High Grass and Weeds** - Overgrown grass and Weeds, Overgrown and/or dead shrubs, dead and/or dying trees that may cause a safety hazard to the public. The grass along the curb & sidewalks are the responsibility of the property owner to be maintained.
- 3. Unfiltered Pools and Ponds** - Pools and Ponds must be actively filtered when filled with water to prevent the spread of mosquitoes.
- 4. Parking of Vehicles on Lawn** - Vehicles can not be parked on front lawns.
- 5. Parking of Trailers, Boats, Campers, and Buses** on streets are prohibited.
- 6. Unlicensed Dogs and Cats** - All dogs and cats must be licensed. The limit of Dogs and Cats per household is 3. (3 dogs and 3 cats maximum per household). The leash law applies to both dogs & cats.
- 7. Fences shall be maintained in good repair.** - "Good repair" meaning but not limited to erect, no broken pieces, no holes, and no peeling paint.

The Code Enforcement Office would like to thank all of the residents, who may have received violations, for their cooperation in correcting any violations or complaints that were received by our office. We appreciate your efforts in helping to keep Lindenwold clean and looking good. After all, a property that is full of junk storage, trash, junk vehicles, high grass, unfiltered pools and the like, effect all of those around it. Not only in quality of life issues, but these violations also depreciate your property value.

**Reminder: State Regulations requires any pool over 24" deep must apply for a permit as well as maintaining proper fencing requirements.**

## New Crime Reporting Software

The Lindenwold Police Department is proud to announce that it has purchased new software for monitoring crime trends within the borough. The software, Crime Reports, uses the department's reporting system to plot every incident on a map, allowing the department to see where crimes are occurring most. Using this data, officers can be deployed to those areas as a more direct method of fighting crime.

This software is web-based and available to the public. Simply go to the website

crimereports.com and register with an email address. Citizens can then view the maps and select any particular type of incident to view using the tabs at the bottom of the page. Citizens can also submit anonymous tips on any of the incidents they view. A prompt to submit a tip is available each time an incident is viewed. If a tip is submitted, that tip is emailed to select members of the department so immediate action can be taken. Tips can be submitted via text message also. Citizens can text "lpd" to CRIMES (274637). A response will be sent to your phone with a link to SMSCrimeTips.com. Open the link and follow the instructions to leave an anonymous tip.

We believe that with the community's help, we can make Lindenwold safer.



## Lindenwold Officer Added to National Law Enforcement Memorial

On December 24, 1946 Ptln. Hugh Shannon of the Lindenwold Police Department was crossing pedestrians on the White Horse Pike in front of St. Lawrence Church. Just before the start of midnight mass, Ptln. Shannon was struck and killed by a hit and run driver. The incident went virtually unnoticed for many years until Lt. Michael McCarthy began researching the incident. Lt. McCarthy's research prompted him to request that Ptln. Shannon be added to the National Police Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C. On February 3, 2012, we received a letter approving Ptln. Shannon's inclusion to the National Memorial. Ptln. Shannon's name will be forever remembered among the names of fallen officers throughout the country. He will be added to the memorial during a candlelight vigil on May 13, 2012. I want to give special thanks to Lt. Michael McCarthy for all of his hard work in making this momentous occasion possible.

# SOLUTIONS TO STORM WATER POLLUTION

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by the rains into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplied and oceans and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste and grass clippings end up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water and that is why we're doing something about it. By sharing the responsibility and making small easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of the stormwater.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties. As a resident, business or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water:

## LIMIT YOUR USE OF FERTILIZER AND PESTICIDES

1. Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer
2. Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted
3. Look into alternatives for pesticides
4. Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in natural state with trees and other native vegetation that require little or no fertilizer
5. If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.

## PROPERLY USE AND DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

1. Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze and paints
2. Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because the storm drains are usually connected to local water bodies and the water is not treated.
3. If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
4. Recycle used motor oil

5. Contact your municipality, county, or facility management office for the locations of hazardous waste disposal facilities.

## KEEP POLLUTION OUT OF STORM DRAINS

1. Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local water bodies.
2. Do not let sewage or other waste flow into a stormwater system.

## CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET

1. Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
2. An example is requiring pet owners or their keeps to pick and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
3. Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law: Remember to use newspapers, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes, dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped waste in a toilet and never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

## DON'T FEED WILDLIFE

1. Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese.
2. Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding

## DON'T LITTER

1. Place litter in trash receptacles
2. Recycle, recycle and recycle
3. Participate in community cleanups

## DISPOSE OF YARD WASTE PROPERLY

1. Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains
2. If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
3. Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost
4. Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

## TAX ASSESSORS OFFICE

The Borough of Lindenwold is undergoing a property revaluation this year for the 2013 tax year. The revaluation was ordered by the Camden County Board of Taxation, under the supervision of the State Division of Taxation. The purpose of the revaluation is to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of Lindenwold's tax levy, giving all property owners only their fair share of the Borough's tax burden. An Introductory letter and revaluation brochure with detailed information has been mailed out by Professional Property Appraisers to all property owners.

There will also be information available on the Borough's website at [www.lindenwoldnj.gov](http://www.lindenwoldnj.gov).

Lindenwold's Department of Assessment Services determines the market value of all real estate within the Borough for assessing purposes. The Assessing Department handles all deed transfers, property owner mailing address changes, tax exempt applications. The Assessor's Office also provides applications for and answers questions about the following property tax deduction programs:

- Income-qualified homeowners who are 65 years and older or disabled may receive a \$250 deduction on their property taxes.
- Qualified veterans and widows of veterans can receive a \$250 deduction in their property taxes.
- Permanently disabled veterans may be entitled to full exemption from property taxes.

The Assessor's Office also administers the five-year residential abatement program. Certain improvements (i.e. additions, decks, sheds, extra bathrooms) which add value to a home, 20 years of age or older, are eligible for a property tax abatement. The value that is added, up to \$15,000, will be abated for five years.

## VEGETATION COLLECTION

Vegetation is collected every Monday curbside from Jan 1 to Oct 31. November and December are leaf collection only.

### — Guidelines —

- Includes, branches limbs, leaves, yard trimmings, shrub clippings, garden trimmings, flowers, grass, needles, pruning debris, plant stalks, and logs no greater than 12 inch diameter.
- Logs greater than 12 inch diameter are collected separately every Thursday, call 783-1848 to be put on the list.
- All material must be on curbside by 6:30 am on collection day.
- Material must be no longer than 4 feet, and if all possible tied and bundled, or stacked neatly at curbside.
- Loose materials must be put in an open container weighting no more than 50 pounds.
- If your collection day falls on or before a holiday, vegetation collection will resume the following working day and continue during the week until all streets have been collected.

There may be times when the volume exceeds our resources, we may not be able to collect all the material in one day, if so, we will continue to collect the following day (or days) until we canvas the town.

## New Borough Hall Update

The Governing Body has hired an engineering firm to prepare the specifications for contractor proposals as well as to oversee the contract administration for the completion of the project. However, there have been a few obstacles along the way. Mold was discovered in the crawlspace and other areas of the sub-flooring which may require remediation. An Air Quality Specialist firm has completed the testing in the crawl space and has recently obtained sampling of the sub-flooring in order to provide a comprehensive analysis of the mold samples. Based on the results of the testing, the Governing Body will review the report for appropriate action. Thank you for your patience and understanding through this process. 


dance scenes, and the costumes of the main characters looked similar as the movie.


