Greetings Lindenwold Family & Friends,

As you all know, this has been a challenging fifteen months for us all. Throughout this public health crisis, our staff has worked tirelessly to ensure that the Lindenwold residents and businesses continued to receive the highest level of municipal services during this most difficult time.

With the Governor lifting restrictions as health metrics have improved, we have opened safely and responsibly.

Borough Hall as well as the Public Library were re-opened to the public on Monday, May 17. Public access resumed with modified days and hours of operation as follows:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9:00am 1:00pm
- Tuesday and Thursday Closed to the public

Residents are encouraged to continue to use the drop box located in the front of the municipal building.

The following departments have also resumed in-person visitation on May 17:

- Department of Public Works: Monday Friday from 6:30am 3:00pm.
- The Municipal Court will continue to conduct Virtual Hearings by Zoom. There are no in-person court sessions. Open Monday to Friday from 9:00am 4:00pm for any payments (No appointments necessary). Encouraged use of the online system for any case inquiries or payments at <u>www.njmcdirect.com</u>. Also, payments can be mailed to 2001 Egg Harbor Road Lindenwold, New Jersey 08021. If you have any questions regarding court, contact the Lindenwold Municipal Court at 856-344-5538.
- Police Department has been open to the public and will remain open Monday through Friday from 9am 4pm.
- All visitors are required to wear masks at all times in public buildings and adhere to the six-foot physical distance requirements and other building protocols.
- The safety of our employees and the public continue to be our top priority. Safety protocols will remain in place at all buildings, and we are grateful for everyone's understanding, patience, and cooperation during this most stressful time.



Here is a list of the top "VIOLATIONS". Let's keep our properties clean and avoid a violation or summons for non-compliance.

- HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS Over grown grass and weeds, overgrown and/or dead shrubs, dead and/or dying trees that may cause a safety hazard. The grass along the curb and the curb and sidewalks are the responsibility of the property owner to maintain.
- 2. UNFILTERED POOLS AND PONDS Pools and ponds must be actively filtered when filled with water to prevent the spread of mosquitoes.
- 3. JUNK/UNREGISTERED VEHICLES Any vehicle that is not legally registered, missing license plates, has flat tires, broken windows, or being used for storage of materials.



- 4. PARKING OF VEHICLES ON LAWNS It is prohibited to park any type of vehicle on lawns.
- 5. DOGS AND CATS All dogs and cats must be licensed. The maximum limit is three (3) dogs and three (3) cats per household. The leash law applies to both dogs and cats.
- 6. HOUSE NUMBERS It is very important to have house numbers on all residential properties, minimum of 4" and visible from the street.

NOTE: Multifamily must have 4" numbers front and back. **This applies to all businesses as well.**

We appreciate your efforts in keeping Lindenwold clean.

MERCANTILE DEPARTMENT:

1. Any new or existing business must file for a mercantile license. Call 856-783-2121 ext. 223 for details.

HOUSING DEPARTMENT:

- 1. All rental properties must file a "registration form"
- 2. All rental properties must be registered and inspected prior to tenant move in
- 3. All sales of property must apply for "application for sale of property inspection"
- 4. Please call 856-783-2121 ext. 224 for details.

Officer Trading Card Contest

Each month, residents under the age of 18 should collect trading cards from officers when appropriate. Officers and the young resident should exchange some unknown fact (hobbies, favorite sports teams, etc.) about each other. Residents should feel free to come to the police station during business hours to obtain trading cards as well!

For safety reasons, please don't approach an officer while they are conducting an investigation.

During the first week of the following month, the young resident and a parent or guardian, should come to police headquarters to have the collected cards counted. (Arrangements can be made for an officer to meet the family at their residence if requested.)

The resident who obtains the most trading cards in a given month will receive an award provided by one of our community sponsors.

In the event of a tie, the winner's name will be selected through a random drawing.

A resident may only win one time during the program. Trading Cards are numbered and cannot be shared among family or friends.

The program will run through December. All participants who collect a full set of trading cards will have their names placed into a drawing to win the grand prize!
